The finance ministry, which has run zaito for more than 100 years, then lends the money out. During the second World War, zaito financed Japan's military build-up. Afterwards, it paid for reconstruction and helped to channel low-cost funds into such strategic industries as steel and car-making. More recently, it has turned to "social" investments, such as infrastructure projects and housing.
